

Presentence report analyses

- the child's reasons for committing an offence and the response of the child to it and
- background factors contributing to the offence

It also must comment on risk:-

- the likelihood of further offending, low, medium or high
- the risk of harm to others as low, medium or high

Leading to.....

Recommendation for sentencing

-a recommendation for sentencing and
- a proposed intervention plan that will
 - punish the child proportionately
 - satisfy the need for public protection
 - prevent further offending and
 - maximise reintegration of the child.

Presentence report AssetPlus screening tool headings

- Mental health and emotional development
- Physical health and development
- Speech, language, communication and neurodisability
- Alcohol / drug use
- Parent / carer self- assessment

School, college, work (8Qs)	Offending (not for prevention cases)	Behaviour (3 Qs)



Custody review -custody cases only (4Qs) Working with the Youth Offending Team (YOT)

Working with probation— for transfer to probation stage only (5 Qs)

Review-review stage only, (not for custody cases) (7Qs)

End of intervention—case closure stage only (9 Qs)
